Additionally, EPEA generates significant socioeconomic benefits to the broader local and provincial economies, summarized below.



Removing Barriers to Education

- EPEA offers upskilling and reskilling programs to African Nova Scotians, which has the potential to support Halifax and Nova Scotia's recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic
- EPEA works to reduce the educational attainment gap that exists for African Nova Scotians



Strengthening Labour Market Integration in Skilled Trades

- EPEA has partnered with government, academia, and industry to deliver successful apprenticeship programs for African Nova Scotians
- EPEA programs support the supply of a diverse workforce in trades in Nova Scotia



Supporting Better Employment Opportunities

- EPEA addresses labour force participation challenges by improving the employability of African Nova Scotians through programs geared towards upgrading skills and navigating the labour market
- Through supporting upskilling and reskilling, EPEA enables individuals to access higher wages



 About 68% of EPEA program participants are employed, with 43% working full time, and 15% working part time.
